7.13 Dual Enrollment Policy

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Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to articulate Ogden Preparatory Academy's (the "School") position on dual enrollment for private school and home schooled students.

Policy

Pursuant to Utah Code Ann §53A-11-102.5, students may be dually enrolled in both the School and in a private or home school under the conditions set forth herein.

A parent seeking to dually enroll a student must certify that the student will receive instruction (a) in the subjects the State Board of Education requires to be taught in public schools and (b) for the same length of time as minors are required to receive instruction in public schools, as provided by rules of the State Board of Education.

All students of the School must be enrolled in the School for at least $\frac{3}{4}$ of each school day (approximately 4.8 hours each day). Therefore, no student of the school will be allowed to dually enroll if they do not plan to attend at least $\frac{3}{4}$ of each school day.

Requests for dual enrollment should be provided to the School's Principal using the Application for Home School Dual Enrollment.

The School will not rearrange the School's class schedule or otherwise reschedule classes in order to accommodate the scheduling needs students who are dually enrolled.

Furthermore, in an effort to provide maximum opportunity to students enrolled at OPA, students enrolled in a private school or home school will not be eligible for participation in extracurricular activities, special services, or any other program sponsored, administered or otherwise paid for by OPA.

Students who are dually enrolled in the School and in a private school or home school will only take the state Criterion Referenced Tests ("CRTs") and other assessments for the subjects for which they receive instruction at the School.
