

- Students (especially kinder) may have assistance from their grownup, but it must be their idea and work.
  - Books may be handwritten or typed.
  - Books can be returned any time after winter break.
- Books that have been turned in for a class grade will not be accepted.
  - Please have at least one original illustration on cover.

All entries will be read by three judges and winners will be announced the end of April or beginning of May. All entries will receive a prize and winners will receive additional prizes. All entries will be shared with the classes.
