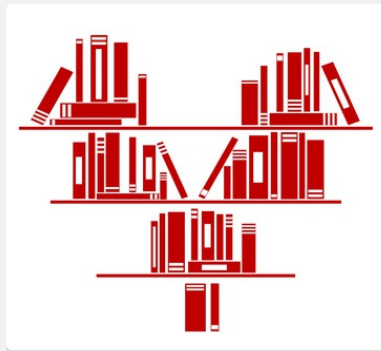

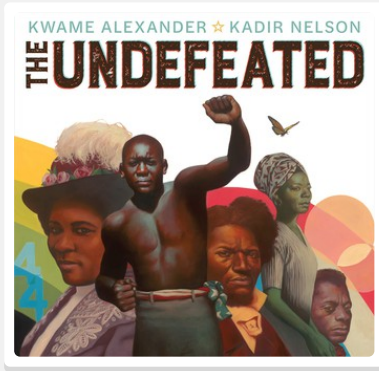
We Are The Water Protectors

This is the first time the Caldecott Award has gone to an indigenous writer.

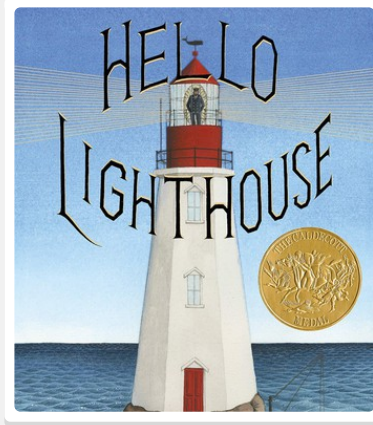

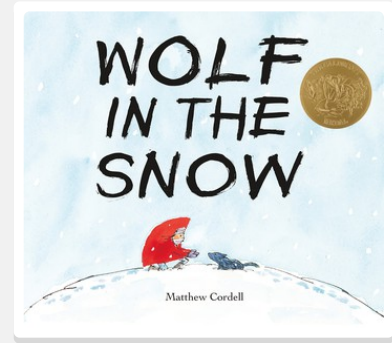

WORLD BOOK TIMELINES

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

1929 Martin Luther King, Jr., American civil to leader, is born.

1948 Martin Luther King, Jr., was ordained a Baptist minister.

1948 Martin Luther King, Jr., graduated from Morehouse College.

1953 Martin Luther King, Jr., married Coretta Scott.

1954 Martin Luther King, Jr., became pastor of Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama.

1957 Martin Luther King, Jr., helped found Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

1957 Martin Luther King, Jr., received a Ph.D. degree in theology from Boston University.

1957 NAACP awarded Martin Luther King, Jr., the Spingarn Medal for his civil rights achievements.

1955 Martin Luther King, Jr., began organizing a movement to protest discrimination against blacks.

1958 *Stride Toward Freedom*, by Martin Luther King, Jr., was published.

1964 Martin Luther King, Jr., entered Morehouse College at age 15.

1964 Congress passed Civil Rights Act of 1964.

1964 Why We Can't Wait, by Martin Luther King, Jr., was published.

1965 Martin Luther King, Jr., helped organize protests against barriers to black voting rights in Selma.

March 1965 Civil rights leader Martin Luther King, Jr., led a march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, to DC.

1966 Martin Luther King, Jr., helped begin a major civil rights campaign in Chicago.

Apr. 4, 1968 Martin Luther King, Jr., American civil rights leader, was assassinated in Memphis, Tennessee.

1967 Martin Luther King, Jr., denounced United States involvement in the Vietnam War.

1968 Martin Luther King, Jr., National Historic Site opened.

Apr. 11, 1968 President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Civil Rights Act of 1968.

1968 James Earl Ray was sentenced to 99 years in prison for the murder of civil rights leader Martin L...
